EU financial supervisory reform in the post-crisis context (2008)

The necessity of new measures in the field of financial regulation and supervision became obvious after the destructive impacts of the global financial crisis in 2008. The interconnectivity of financial systems in the context of globalisation, imbalances in the Eurozone and the impossibility to adjust the exchange rate on a national level in the Eurozone require special attention to financial regulatory and supervisory matters. The article examines the main changes in the system of financial regulation and supervision after the crisis. These changes include the creation of the European System of Financial Supervision, the establishment of the Banking Union and the strengthening of legislative framework for financial stability. The main problems of the new financial regulation and supervision are revealed. Fragmentation in financial regulation and supervision, moral hazard, low profitability of financial institutions and sovereign-bank nexus are among these problems.
